Highlights major developments in health care in the 1800s, including the discovery of germs and innovations in surgical tools and medicines.

Joint Ventures:

Traces the history of joint replacement and the problems researchers have faced, including choice of materials and the shape and size of replacements.

Potions, Pills and Prescriptions:

Displays the three options for health care available to families at the turn of the century: home care, the druggist, and the doctor.

Nursing Education at Kingston General Hospital:

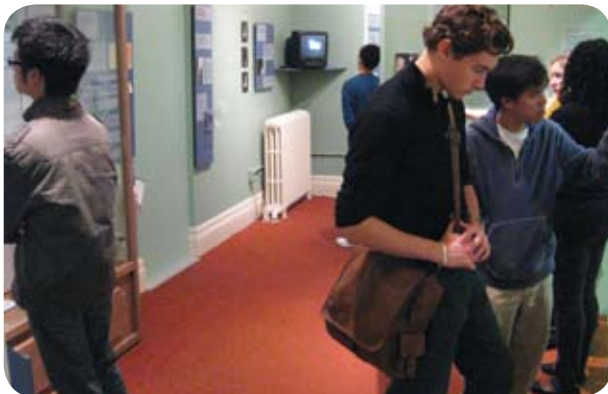
Explores the training, work, and residence life of the more than 3000 students who attended the KGH School of Nursing between 1886 and 1974.

Electricity and The Invisible Ray:

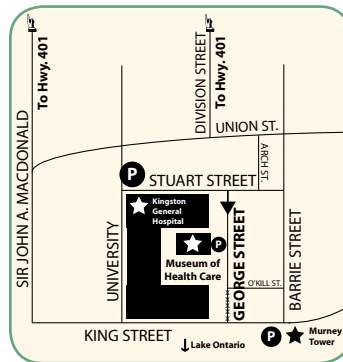

Program Options

Reflect & Detect

Gallery link: *When Medicine Met Science*
Ages 4-10 ● 20 minutes

Students discover the tools that were invented and the major changes that occurred in health care between 1800 and 1900. After learning how and why reflector headbands were used by health

care professionals students create their own personalized reflector headbands during a craft activity.



Construct-a-Skeleton

Gallery link: *Joint Ventures*
Ages 4-10 ● 20 minutes

How many bones do we have inside of us? How can we protect our bones and keep them healthy? What is a hinge joint and how does it help us to move? Students learn about the bones

and joints in the human body and then work in groups to correctly assemble a skeleton.



Marketing Medicine

Gallery link: *Potions, Pills & Prescriptions*
Ages 8-12 ● 60 minutes

In 1900 a sick person had three treatment options: home care, the druggist, and the doctor. Druggists were not fully trusted and the patent medicines they distributed were sometimes harmful.

Students will analyze and critique the advertisements used to sell patent medicines at the turn of the century and create an advertisement for their own patent medicine.



Pin the Organ on the Body

Gallery link: *When Medicine Met Science*
Ages 6-12 ● 30 minutes

This wild and wacky introduction to the human body's major organs includes jumping jacks, blindfolds, and paper stethoscopes! Students learn how the stethoscope was invented, listen to each other's heartbeats before and after exercise, and play a game to correctly place organs on a funny body of their own creation.



What Is It?

Gallery link: Museum Collection
Suitable for all ages
10 minute icebreaker
or 30 minute activity

It's a bird! It's a plane! No, it's an otoscope! This hands-on artefact identification activity provides an exciting introduction to some of the items in the Museum's collection. Students measure and examine the mystery artefacts, searching for clues to figure out what they are and how they were used.



Scavenger Hunts

Our challenging scavenger hunts send students on a treasure hunt through the Museum's galleries as they work to complete a skill-testing activity sheet.
