The Collections Technician will work directly with the extensive collection of medical and health care objects and archival documents under the direction and supervision of the Collections Manager.

Projects during this work term:

- Catalogue new donations, revise selected catalogue records, and update on-line database using InMagic V2016
- Create digital images in a photo studio set up and edit with Photoshop V6 software
- Complete minor research to confirm dates of manufacture, etc.
- Propose items for deaccession: create inventory with visual record of proposed objects for deaccession from 2016 Inventory Project & others in a report for Collections Committee approvals
- Update Emergency & Disaster Plan
- Research and write a blog post
- Assist with a review of the collection for at least one medical category
- Update procedure manual for cataloguing with new software
- Create Artifact Handling Manual
- Prepare objects for storage according to accepted museological, collections management and conservation standards
- Conduct regular integrated pest management inspections and monitor storage areas for temperature fluctuations
- Keep accurate records through accession logs, donor files, cataloguing & inventory charts and a daily activity log
- Conduct collections storage rooms tours with a prepared script on one medical topic per storage room as required

• Assist in the presentation of museum public programming that occurs during the work term

QUALIFICATIONS:

- An enthusiasm for Canadian history, its preservation and promotion
- Experience working in a museum environment especially in collections management, cataloguing and handling artefacts will be considered an asset
- Academic studies especially in museums studies, history and/or history of medicine or related disciplines will be considered an asset
- Strong attention to detail and ability to work independently
- Enjoy working with lists of numbers, creating order and analyzing results, with accuracy

- Previous museum experience by yourself and not as a group effort: handling artefacts, taking and editing a minimum of 20 digital images of objects in a photo studio setup and conducting an inventory of large collections will be considered assets
- Experience with digital photography in a photo studio set up and Photoshop V6 will be considered assets
- Basic research skills using various sources, both paper-based and electronic
- Ability to monitor and maintain a safe work area
- Excellent interpersonal skills
- Strong organizational and time management skills, ability to work effectively with multiple tasks and tight deadlines and problem solving skills
- Ability to sit for long periods of time at a computer
- Willingness to complete a Skills Analysis Test to catalogue and photograph an object as a major portion of the interview process

- Meet the requirements of YCW and CSJ eligibility and be registered with YCW. Candidates must be between 16 and 30 years of age at the start of employment, full-time students intending to return to their studies in the next school year, and eligible to work in Canada.
