"Kingstonians may already be familiar with Dr. Baran, either because he is their family physician or because of his historical reenactments," says Toews. "Always medically and historically accurate, Dr. Baran can capture the undivided attention of children and adults alike with mock amputations, outdated medical advice, and real surgical artifacts."

"Youth won't learn that doctors are scary, but rather that health care has progressed a long way. Everyone will be relieved that it's 2011!" says Toews.
