Healthy eating at the Museum of Health Care -- "Yum, Yum, MUNCH!" program for children

(KINGSTON, Ont.) – The Museum of Health Care is offering a hands-on March Break Program that will teach children about healthy eating and digestion.

According to the Museum's Program Director Catherine Toews, children aged six and up will learn through hands-on activities about what happens to the food we eat and how it fuels the body.

"We're going to cover the passage of food from 'chew to poo' (so to speak), as well as healthy eating and active living as per Canada's Food Guide" says Toews. "Children will play a mystery food game, examine real teeth, act out the processes of the digestive system, and take home their own customized Food Superhero Magnet."
