History of Medicine Trivia Night to challenge contestants

(KINGSTON, ON) - On September 25th, the Museum of Health Care at Kingston and the What Happened in Medicine (WHIM) Historical Society will offer a History of Medicine Trivia Night at Queen's University's The Grad Club. Trivia enthusiasts are invited to pit their wit against fellow contestants in this friendly competition featuring four rounds of questions. Admission is free.

"Our History of Medicine Trivia Night is a chance for Kingstonians to test their historical savvy in a fun and social way," says Museum Communications and Finance Coordinator Kirsi Hunnakko. "Kingston has played a significant role in the history of health care in Canada and remains a centre for high-quality health care and health care education. With that in mind, we would like to issue a particular challenge to those who work or study in the health care fields to come out and prove their mettle, although those with medical knowledge are not assured an advantage," she adds.

The Museum of Health Care has been dedicated to preserving and sharing the history of health care in Canada since its inception in 1991. Based in the Ann Baillie Building National Historic Site at 32 George Street, the Museum is now home to a collection of nearly 40,000 health care artefacts. The What Happened in Medicine (WHIM) Historical Society was formed by a group of medical students in 2017 to promote the rich history of medicine at the Queen's School of Medicine. Inspired by Dr. Jacalyn Duffin's efforts, the society believes that an awareness of medical history is indispensable to students as they become future physicians, and it aims to support any and all history of medicine activities at Queen's.

No registration is required for the event and participants are invited to come as a team or form a team with others that evening. The top three teams will win prizes donated by event sponsors The Haunted Walk of Kingston, Improbable Escapes, Minotaur Games and Gifts, The Screening Room, and The Grad Club.
